Michael Del Piero Good Design Studio and Home Furnishings Boutique

A study in texture and neutral tones, Michael Del Piero's gorgeous Bucktown spot opened last year as a place for the seasoned decorator to fill with finds from her travels around the world, plus well-edited selections from Chicago's own artistic community. Our picks: Neolithic pots, vibrant African cloths, and Argentinean antiques, as well as local sculptor Lucy Slivinski's large woven light fixtures, which hang throughout the space.

George Lowell Arduser recently relocated his two-year-old design shop from Lakeview to Andersonville, where the roomy space allows for a wide assortment of contemporary and vintage furnishings, small accents, and large-scale pieces. Sprinkled throughout, you'll find super-affordable art and accessories, including an unusual, organic-feeling wall installation of gold-leafed

resin pods for \$55, and hefty replicas of the foot of Michelangelo's David (\$65) to accentuate a bookshelf.

Alessandra Branca's exquisite Gold Coast boutique transmits her classic-with-an-edge sensibility, from the signature red, white, and black palette to the striking accessories—beautiful Phaidon coffee-table books, anodized aluminum insect coasters by Eduardo Garza, and Branca's own striped organic cotton blankets—all set among 18th-century antiques and vintage replicas.

At Home in the City

Last fall, Susan Fredman—who's been doing interior design for more than 30 years and owns another decor shop in Michigan called At Home With Nature—debuted this modern-rustic lifestyle store next door to her River North design studio. A fun, eclectic mix of high and low, the emporium houses gift-ready items, like silver okra-shaped salt and pepper shakers and studded patent leather placemats, as well as elegant custom-order furniture.
